



Fireworks may be legally discharged on private property in Spring Hill beginning July 3 - July 6, from 8:00a.m. - 11:00p.m. The City wants everyone to enjoy the 4th of July in a safe and responsible manner. Please respect your neighborhood and clean up the debris after your celebration event.



CITY PARKS REGULATIONS

It's that time of year where many residents are enjoying our local City Parks. In order to keep the parks clean and safe for everyone, please abide by park rules. The parks are regularly patrolled and any violation of City Ordinances can result in fines, imprisonment or both. Unlawful use of the City Parks is as follows:

- No alcoholic beverages
- No possession or use of firearms
- No motorized vehicles
- No damage, modification, removal or addition of park amenities, trees, turf or any public property
- No glass containers
- No burning or open fires
- No dumping
- No hunting, trapping, killing of any animal, bird or waterfowl

Park hours are between 6:00a.m. and 10:00p.m. and are on a first-come, first-served basis. Requests for the use of the City Parks outside of park hours must be submitted in writing to the City Clerk. Public Property, Article 1a and Article 2.
