PARTY SPONSORSHIP: \$200
Business name listed on a vinyl banner that will be displayed near the entrance of the pool for the entire day of each of the four parties, plus all other advertising.

NOW HIRING LIFEGUARDS!

Looking for a fun way to earn money this summer? The City of Spring Hill, now directly managing the Spring Hill Aquatic Center, is hiring lifeguards for the 2015 pool season.

Lifeguards are responsible for the supervision of pool patrons, maintaining training standards, daily pool maintenance, operational activities, and recordkeeping.

To be a lifeguard, you must be at least 15 years of age and become certified through Red Cross Lifeguard Training. The City will pay for half of your training fee.

ONE STEP CLOSER TO A NEW PARK

The Spring Hill City Council approved several motions that annexed land just north of the future West Lake Park into the city. This is the first step in providing the City access to build a road to the new park. Once the City is granted access, design work can begin on the project! City staff expect to break ground on the park later this year.

APRIL 23 MEETING

CITY COUNCIL WELCOMES NEW MEMBER

The Spring Hill Governing Body and staff welcomed one new and two returning City Council members, who were sworn in after receiving the top votes in the April 7 election. Andrea Hughes was elected to serve her first term on the City Council, and incumbents Clint Gillis, Jr. and Floyd Koder were reelected to the Council.

The Council also selected Councilman Chris Leaton to serve as Council President for another term. After the recently elected and re-elected Council members were sworn in, the Governing Body discussed contracts for the Spring Hill Aquatic Center and the City's new Strategic Communications Plan.
