



Spring Hill Aquatic Center + Aquatic Center Park | 20900 Sycamore Drive

With more than a dozen fun features, including several slides, a lazy river ride, and a toddler play area, the Spring Hill Aquatic Center is the City's busiest destination during the summer! Daily admission is \$5 or free for toddlers (2 and under) and seniors (62+). For membership rates, see our website.

The Aquatic Center Park is a great place to have a picnic before enjoying all the great water features at the Aquatic Center! Features include a charcoal grill, pavilion, picnic table, and playground.



Blackhawk Park | Behind Blackhawk Plaza at Harrison & 223rd Streets

This four-acre park features walking trails, a children's slide with a modular play set, a swing set, a charcoal grill, and two picnic tables. Access is by way of a paved walking trail that can be entered off of Victory Road from the east and Franklin Street from the west.



City Park | Hale and Washington streets

City Park covers a full block dotted in mature shade trees. A beautiful stone water feature commemorates the City's sesquicentennial birthday, and the gazebo is a popular gathering place. Amenities include picnic tables, swings, playground equipment, and access to electricity and water.



Celia Dayton Park | Franklin & Allen streets

Named after former resident Celia Dayton, the first woman doctor in Kansas, this park includes a climbing boulder, a small swing set, a charcoal grill, benches, and picnic tables.



Friendship Park | 401 N. Madison

This large open park located just north of the Spring Hill Civic Center is a perfect spot for playing catch as a family. The park includes a large playground, slides, picnic tables, and a sand pit for toddlers.



Melvin Murry Park | 207th St. & Barker Rd.

This 16.31-acre park named after the city's former longtime volunteer fire chief allows visitors to enjoy a slice of the rural outdoors within the city limits. The lower of the park's two ponds is stocked occasionally and is part of the Community fisheries program (CFAP). This cooperative program between communities and the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks offers anglers who hold a state fishing license free access to cooperating community lakes. Due to this program, the City of Spring Hill does not require a city permit to fish (state license is required).



COMING SOON: Veterans Park

Work on Spring Hill's newest park, Veterans Park, will continue through 2017. This sprawling site on the west side of City Lake is slated to have a playground installed and a final design completed in 2017. Conceptual drawings of the park feature trails, fishing piers, a dog park, outdoor education areas, a playground, and shelters.
