

### COVID-19 PROTOCOL

The Spring Hill Aquatic Center will have a limited outdoor pool season by opening to Spring Hill residents and non-residents (limited sessions). Due to the limited season, renewing or purchasing season passes for 2021 will not be available.

- Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult
- Masks are required at all times, except while actively eating or in the water
- Guests are asked to bring own towels and chairs
- Limited concessions available
- Check in will begin 15 minutes prior to each open swim session
- Entrance through the breezeway, exit through the side gate by the playground
- We will close for 30 minutes after each open swim session to clean and disinfect
- We will close for 15 minutes after each swim lesson/activity to clean and disinfect



# OPEN SWIM + ADMISSION

## ADMISSION RATES

Daily admission: \$3

Senior admission (62 and older): Free

Toddler admission (2 and under): Free

*Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult*

## PUNCH PASSES

**Punch passes: \$27 for 10 visits**

Bring your punch pass for each visit! After it's filled, another punch pass can be purchased. Punch passes do not expire and can be used in the next pool season.

## PURCHASE OPTIONS

**Due to COVID-19, we will not offer season passes for this year.** We will only offer a reduced daily admission or a reduced punch pass this year! Visit us at the Reservations window (near the main entrance) at City Hall, 401 N. Madison St., to purchase a punch pass. You can also purchase at the Aquatic Center, beginning May 30.

## OPEN SWIM HOURS

With COVID-19 forcing a closure of our pool last year, we are so excited to bring you a 2021 season! However, this season is going to look a little different to comply with Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines.

This year, we will bring you two Open Swim sessions! Reservations are not required and up to 229 patrons will be admitted on a first-come, first-served basis for each session.

Open Swim sessions will be as follows:

**Sunday through Saturday**  
— Noon to 3 p.m.  
— 3:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.

The pool will be closed from 3 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. for cleaning. From 6:45 p.m. to 7:30 p.m., we will be open for river walking and swim lessons only!

## WATER FITNESS

River walking will return this year in two different forms!

New this year: We will offer both regular river walking with jets turned on to offer maximum resistance and also low-impact river walking with no jets, just walking through the water and its natural resistance. Both of these workouts are great for joints, muscles, and bones. The water's resistance helps you to build strength while you stay cool.

The lazy river at the Spring Hill Aquatic Center will be open to walkers Monday through Friday. Walkers must be 16 and older to participate. River walking punch passes can be purchased at City Hall (starting April 1) or at the Aquatic Center. **A \$15 punch pass covers five visits.**

Swim lessons are back!

This year, we will be conducting private swim lessons only throughout the entire summer. Private swim lessons are a great way for your child to receive one-on-one training!

Lessons will be in one-week sessions (Monday through Friday) with various time slots in the morning and evening. So we can achieve one-on-one, personalized training, there will be five openings per time slot. Participants must choose one time slot for the entire week. **Sessions are \$100 for five lessons.**

# City seeking feedback on chickens

The Spring Hill City Council is seeking feedback on whether to permit chickens in the city limits.

At the March 11 City Council meeting, the Governing Body discussed the subject of whether or not to allow chickens in the Spring Hill city limits. It was the consensus to gather resident feedback — positive and negative — on the proposed ordinance. In May 2020, a group of teens petitioned the City to allow chickens in the City limits. Over the last several months, staff from the Police and Community Development departments researched the subject.

With a number of homeowner associations (HOA) in our area, it's important you review your HOA covenants to see

whether it allows the keeping of chickens. HOAs can be more restrictive than City ordinances with enforcement done by the HOA and not the City.

Residents can submit their feedback to the Governing Body or by emailing [publicaffairs@springhillks.gov](mailto:publicaffairs@springhillks.gov) by Friday, April 16. The ordinance will be discussed at the April 22 City Council meeting. City Council meetings are on the second and fourth Thursday of each month at 7 p.m. in the Spring Hill Civic Center, 401 N. Madison St. Meetings can also be viewed live on the City's YouTube channel.

# Spring clean your yard with free pickup

Yard waste is collected by the City's contracted trash service Waste Management and included with regular trash pick up for most of the year. Some dates within the winter months are excluded.

## Please follow these guidelines for pickup:

- Only natural waste is picked up.
- Please have your items placed at the curb by 6 a.m. the morning of your service day. Items must be accessible from the street.
- The maximum weight of any single bag must not exceed 50 pounds. All bags must be compostable and be closed by rolling down

the top of the bag. Make sure you do not use staples or tape to secure the bag. Trash bags will not be taken and compost material in cans is unacceptable and will be left behind.

— Brush must be tied into bundles 18" x 48" long. Tie securely with rope or twine, not wire. Plastic rope is unacceptable. Please mark all items with thorns for the safety of our workers.

— Eight compostable bags or bundles will be accepted each week of scheduled collection. This limit increases to 10 in the fall each year.
