NEW UTILITY RATES IN EFFECT

Trash rates will adjust this month as part of the City's contract with Waste Management, which includes annual rate increases. Regular trash service will be \$21.19, and senior rates will be \$20.19. The contract also includes monthly large item pickup, unlimited recycling (glass recycling at Price Chopper, 22350 S. Harrison St.), and yard waste pickup most of the year. Residents will see the new rates reflected on this month's utility bills.



What to Know Before You Start Your Project: Permits & City Codes



When Do You Need a Permit?

Many home projects require a permit, including fences, decks, and reroofs. Some projects may surprise you—sheds, above-ground pools, hot tubs, and gazebos all need approval before installation.



What Happens If There's a Violation?

If a violation is found, the property owner or renter receives a notice to correct the issue within a set time-frame. If not addressed, a citation may follow.



What Doesn't Require a Permit?

Repairs like painting, fixing loose boards on a deck, or installing new windows or siding don't need a permit. However, certain projects, like irrigation systems or small deck repairs, must still follow city codes.



Code Enforcement: Common Violations

Code violations can happen year-round, but tall grass, trash, and yard waste are common in the spring and summer.



How to Apply for a Permit

Applying for a permit or reporting a code violation is easy and available online 24/7 through our portal on OpenGov linked below. Small project permits typically cost \$30-\$50, with processing times of 7-10 business days.
