## Spring Hill Water Utility to Merge with WaterOne in January

### Expect lower water utility rates!

Starting in January 2026, WaterOne will become the new water utility provider for all current City of Spring Hill customers.

The City is merging its water system with WaterOne - a national award-winning water provider - to help streamline the consistency of residents' water services and to lower water utility rates.

The merger affects nearly 1,800 Spring Hill households that aren't currently serviced by WaterOne.

"Switching to WaterOne is great for our residents," City Administrator Lane Massey said. "They're going to see a lower water utility bill every two months, and it puts everyone together on the same water source."



Residents can expect to receive their first water utility bill from WaterOne in March 2026. They'll be billed every other month after that. All Spring Hill residents will continue to receive a bill from the City for trash and sewer services.

### Next Steps

- WaterOne staff will visit Spring Hill by mid-February to help set up online billing and customer service needs in person.
- Watch for follow-up communication from the City and WaterOne with updated information about the merger.

### Customer Service Questions

The City will continue to support your billing questions or concerns about the taste or quality of your water until WaterOne takes over billing in March.


## Pay Tribute on Veterans Day
