

Yearlong Road Construction on 199th St.

Watch for traffic delays on 199th St. between Ridgeview and Renner roads.

Spring Hill Water Utility Merger with WaterOne Starts January 20

Expect the first bill in March 2026

On Jan. 20, WaterOne will become the new water utility provider for all City of Spring Hill customers.

The City is merging its water system with WaterOne to help streamline the consistency of residents' water services and to lower water utility rates.



This merger affects 1,800 residents who aren't currently using WaterOne as their water utility provider. All Spring Hill residents will continue to receive a bill from the City for trash and sewer services.

What's Next

- Starting Jan. 20, the 1,800 residents will automatically be registered for WaterOne services. Customers can register their accounts online to see their water usage or switch to online billing (recommended but not required).
- Residents can expect to see their first bill in March.
- Visit the Spring Hill Civic Center on Thursday, Feb. 12, anytime between noon and 7 p.m., to speak in person with WaterOne representatives. You can get help setting up online billing and other customer service needs.

Know Your Emergency Snow Routes

Help us clear the roads faster!

We know there'll be snow and ice this winter season, so help our Public Works crews clear the streets safely and quickly during winter weather events with these seven tips:

- 1. Stay off the roads.** The fewer vehicles on the road, the faster crews can get them cleared.
- 2. Don't park on emergency snow routes.** Scan the QR code below to see the 2026 Snow Emergency Route map.
- 3. Don't park within a cul-de-sac.** Crews are unable to safely remove snow due to the size of the snowplow trucks.
- 4. Park your vehicle in your driveway.** This helps drivers plow the entire road.
- 5. Avoid shoveling the snow from your driveway into the street.** This will help keep your driveway clear when plows come by.
- 6. Remove portable basketball goals or other structures.** This avoids possible damage to the truck or your equipment.
- 7. Stay at least 50 feet back from a snowplow truck.** If you can't see the driver, they can't see you.

New Rules for Golf Carts and UTVs on the City Roads; Speed Limit Lowered to 30 MPH on Webster St. and Victory Road

Fore! Golf carts are now allowed on Webster St. and Victory Road. At the Nov. 13 Spring Hill City Council meeting, Councilmembers voted to lower the speed limit to 30 mph on Webster St., from North St. south to Victory Road, and on Victory Road, south to 226th St., so golf carts can safely use that stretch of road.


The City Council also approved changes to local ordinances affecting work-site vehicles/UTVs. These vehicles were prohibited within City limits before the amendments. See below for the updated and unchanged rules.

New Golf Cart Rules

- The maximum street speed where golf carts can operate is now 30 mph (up from 25 mph).
- Golf carts are allowed on designated streets with speed limits up to 30 mph (see green lines on map to right).
- Drivers must stay as close to the right side of the road as possible.

Unchanged Golf Cart Requirements

- Drivers must be 16 or older with a valid, unrestricted driver's license.
- Drivers must have insurance.
- Drivers must display a "slow-moving vehicle" emblem on the back.
- Golf carts aren't allowed on sidewalks or trails.
- Golf carts can be used from sunrise to sunset, unless the golf cart has motorcycle-style lighting.



New UTV Rules

- UTVs are now allowed on designated streets with speed limits up to 45 mph (see purple lines on map above).
- UTVs must have lights, turn signals, reflectors, and rearview and side mirrors.
- Drivers must have insurance and a valid, unrestricted driver's license.
